

# CAMP DIXIE LUTHERAN OUTDOOR MINISTRIES

Camper, guest and staff safety is of utmost importance to us here at Camp Dixie. In an effort to reduce the risks of the COVID-19 and other transmittable illnesses, we are implementing the following safety plan. Many of these are procedures we have always been, and will continue to be, committed to; some procedures we are enhancing to reduce risk; and a few are newly implemented in an effort to be a part of the solution to COVID-19. Camp Dixie will continue to follow the executive orders and recommendations of the Governor's office, CDC and our local Health Department.

## **BEFORE CAMP**

### **PARENTS' ROLE:**

- For 14 days prior to your camp session:
- Reduce exposure to others
- Reinforce proper personal hygiene procedures
- Monitor for symptoms
- Refrain from sending any campers who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 or displays symptoms.

### **CAMP DIXIE'S ROLE:**

- Update procedures and safety plan in accordance state and local health department guidelines
- Intensified & frequent cleaning
- Enhanced education and training for staff regarding health & safety protocols
- Health screening of all campers & staff upon arrival

## **DURING CAMP**

### **CAMPER SAFETY:**

- Socially distanced check-in and closing
- Proper handwashing & personal hygiene emphasized
- Campers will travel & interact with smaller cohorts
- Modified dining procedures to reduce exposure to others
- Modified camp activities to reduce exposure

### **FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT:**

- CDC-approved quad-sanitizing disinfectant used on all high-touch surfaces in cabins and bathrooms
- Common surfaces in dining hall, trading post, and at activities are sanitized multiple times a day
- All equipment sanitized before and after use

### **DAILY MEDICAL CARE:**

- Daily symptoms check for campers and staff
- Designated isolation locations for those exhibiting symptoms

### **SWIFT RESPONSE TO ILLNESS:**

- Immediate isolation of campers and staff with symptoms
- Symptomatic campers and staff will be assessed and sent home if appropriate
- Clear communication to all involved
- Closely work with local and state health officials throughout

## **AFTER CAMP**

### **CAMPUS SANITIZATION:**

- Set aside more time to clean and sanitize our facilities and equipment

### **LIMIT INTERACTION:**

- Campers should limit interaction for 14 days after leaving camp
