



Welcome to Camp Dixie Lutheran Outdoor Ministry Center!

Thank you for hosting your retreat at Camp Dixie, please let us know how we can best serve you. Below are some guidelines as you participate in your retreat at Camp Dixie.

We hope you can use this time and place for spiritual renewal, reflecting on the blessings God gives us through salvation in Jesus Christ and the glories of His wondrous outdoors. All minors should be accompanied by an adult while at Camp Dixie. If a youth participant goes outside, so should an adult for supervision. Pre-arranged activities and equipment are available upon request. Please let us know if you would like us to lead an activity for your group.

There are no food or snacks allowed in the dorms. All food should be eaten in the Dining Hall only. When outside, food or drinks should be taken only to the picnic pavilion, otherwise all food items should be eaten in the Dining Hall.

We are striving to become a "green" camp. Please help us accomplish this goal by turning on air conditioning or heat only when necessary, and keeping all outside doors closed. Please turn off lights when you are not using the rooms, and make sure all water faucets (including the showers) are all the way off when not in use.

Swimming and canoeing are to be done only under the supervision of a certified lifeguard. If your group does not have one available, you must sign a Release Agreement for each person, or one can be hired for \$15.00 per hour. Please ask the director for availability. If your group has a lifeguard, certification must be validated before your group enters the water. Everyone using the canoes must wear a life jacket (both adults and children.)

Please stay off all challenge course elements in the woods. Each one has a sign identifying it as a challenge course element, which shall be used with Camp Dixie staff leadership only.

If you have a medical emergency, the nearest hospital is South Baldwin Hospital in Foley. To get there take highway 95 (at the end of Josephine Drive) to highway 98. Take a left (west) and follow that to Foley. Then take a right (north) onto highway 59. The hospital will be on the left-hand side of the road after a few miles. 911 service is available in this area if you are not able to transport for some reason. If you need a phone in an emergency, the Director's house has the nearest land phone line.

Please leave Camp Dixie as clean or cleaner than you found it. Cleaning guidelines are included in this packet. Please remember to put away any sports equipment and kitchen utensils or plates and bowls you may have used before you leave.
